LETTERING ON WOOD





THIS IS ALL YOU NEED

» Wooden board
 » Approx. 200-300 nails (depending on the length of lettering you choose)
» Printer
» Wool
» Hammer
» Scissors

LETTERING ON WOOD DECORATIVE PIECE OF NATURE FOR THE KITCHEN WALL

Often, finding suitable pictures for the kitchen wall is not that easy. So, why not be creative and make one yourself? Lettering on wood provides a way of adding personal expression, leaving you to choose the words yourself!

METHOD

- **01.** Print off your chosen lettering on one or more sheets of paper and place them on the board. This way you can see how to position the lettering and not end up with parts of it not fitting on the board.
- **02.** Knock the nails through the paper along the side edges of the letters so they sit firmly in the wood. However, they should be left standing proud by about 2 cm to give the lettering the 3D effect you want to achieve.
- **03.** Now remove the template paper from between the board and nails.





- **04.** To start with the wool, first take a nail at the corner of the first letter and firmly tie the end of the wool thread to it.
- **05.** Now you can simply zigzag back and forth between the nails of the first letter to create any pattern you like. Here, it is important to keep the wool thread taut.
- **06.** It's a good idea to attach the thread at one or two points on the outer edge, i.e. not in zigzag fashion but in a straight line along the nails. This gives the letter an outline and makes it stand out better.
- **07.** Finally, all you have to do now is firmly knot the thread on one of the nails and cut it off. Proceed in this way with all of the letters your 3D lettering is now complete!
